What is GOARN?

Established in 2000, GOARN is a global technical partnership coordinated by WHO



Who is GOARN?

Consists of over 300 technical institutions and networks providing technical support for alert and outbreak response



What does GOARN do?

Provides coordination and rapid multi-disciplinary technical support for outbreak response

GOARN PROCESS FOR MANAGING EVENTS / OPERATIONS

STEP 1



Events / Operations
Identification of an Event / Operations that may threaten international public health

STEP 2



Alert
Alert raised based on the outcome of the Event / Operations risk assessment

STEP 3



Request for Assistance
National health authorities request assistance from GOARN through WHO

STEP 4




Offer
GOARN partner focal points upload expert profiles to assist response

STEP 5



Deployment
Selected experts are contracted by WHO to deploy with GOARN for the mission

GOARN TRAINING PROGRAMME




Greater need for greater numbers of individuals trained.
